"Recognizing that breeders have made their own choices regarding Foundation ewe breeds to institute their upgrading programs using purebred Valais Blacknose semen, there are no restrictions placed on the breed type of the Foundation Ewe by the VBSS. These ewes will have to be submitted for entry into the VBSS database and the ewe will be issued a Foundation Ewe Certificate containing her lineage information and her registration in any other breed Registry."

If applicable, please include a copy of the registration papers. If ewe is unregistered, please provide as complete as possible, background information. Foundation ewes will be assigned a % value of zero (0) Valais Blacknose blood.

#### Foundation Ewe Application Use

This form is designed to provide as much information as is possible on the ewe that has been used in the upgrading project to produce F-1 offspring. For 2018, all submissions for Recorded Stock must be accompanied by this application defining the breed background and history of the dam used. This information will be valuable to all breeders involved in the upgrading project as the generations proceed toward purebred.

The registrar will record all submitted data and issue a Foundation Ewe Certificate. There is a \$5 fee that should accompany the application.
